2. Context area

Name of creators: Lillias Mitchell, 1915-2000.

Biographical note:

Lillias Mitchell was born in Dublin in 1915. While a teenager she studied painting and sculpture with Elizabeth Corbet Yeats, Lilian Davidson, and others. Mitchell was an exhibiting member of the Watercolour Society from 1940. In 1943 she moved to North Wales to teach clay modelling where in addition she was required to teach weaving under the direction of Ella McLeod. In 1946 Mitchell returned to Dublin and set up a school of weaving called the Golden Fleece with Morfudd Roberts. In 1949 Morfudd Roberts left Ireland to take up a teaching post in England, and Lillias, realising that she could not manage the school on her own, was encouraged to approach the Department of Education. There in 1950 she met the then Minister of Education who invited her to set up a weaving department in the National College of Art. Lillias then went to Sweden to extend her weaving knowledge by attending a summer school and to purchase looms. In 1951 she returned with the looms to set up the Weaving Department in two rooms in the National College of Art. As the Weaving Department expanded it was moved into two prefabricated huts in the garden of Dail Eireann and there Lillias taught weaving spinning and dyeing until she retired in 1979.

In 1975 Lillias Mitchell founded the Irish Guild of Weavers Spinners and Dyers and took a great interest in its development. When the Jesse Mitchell Trust closed in 1994, Lillias sponsored the Lillias Mitchell Prize in the Royal Dublin Society's National Craft Competition. After her retirement Lillias focused on painting. In 1979 she was elected to membership of the Royal Hibernian Academy and exhibited several times during the 1980s and 90s. Mitchell was made an Honorary Member of the Royal Hibernian Academy in 1995 and an Honorary Life Member of the Royal Dublin Society in 1993. Lillias Mitchell died 10 January 2000.

Includes four manuscript letters from Yeats to Mitchell discussing arrangements for children's art classes and to participation of Mitchell's daughter, Lillias Mitchell, in Yeats's Brush work classes.

Letter from Elizabeth Corbet Yeats, Cuala industries, 82 Merrion square, Dublin to Mrs Mitchell.

Manuscript. Relates to Mitchell's role in assembling a class of approximately ten children to be taught painting by Yeats at Mrs Macaulay's. States fees of 2 guineas, per child, per 12 week term, based on a class of 10 pupils, and discusses materials and other related matters.

Letter from Elizabeth Corbet Yeats, Gurteen Dhas, Dundrum to Mrs. Mitchell.

Manuscript. Yeats writes to correct her statement of fees at 2 guineas, per child, per 12 week term to 1 guinea, per child, per term, based on a class of 12 pupils. Suggests a possible collaboration with a Miss Sweeney who runs [Temple] school in [Palmerstown], Dublin.

Letter with envelope from Elizabeth Corbet Yeats to Mrs Mitchell. Manuscript. Yeats writes to relate details of a lamp shade painting project which she has set for her painting pupils, which include Lillias Mitchell. Yeats relates where the shade may be purchased, costs, and expected time investment. Yeats compliments Lillias Mitchell's talent.

Letter from Elizabeth Corbet Yeats, 133 lower Baggot street, Dublin, to Mrs Mitchell.

Manuscript. Yeats discusses her pleasure in teaching painting to Lillias Mitchell and makes recommendations for the development of Lillias's painting skill. Also refers to the death of her aunt [Alice Pollexfen Jackson] and convey sympathy in relation to Mitchell's recent loss. File also includes a holograph typescript copy of the letter.
