



This colourful array of French scenes, charting the work of Irish artist Roderic O'Conor (1860-1940) and his contemporaries, features Van Gogh's *Champ de blé aux bleuet (Wheatfield with Cornflowers)*, 1890; O'Conor's *Field of Corn, Pont-Aven*, 1892; and Gauguin's *Bowl of Fruit and Tankard before a Window*, c.1890.

The annual competition showcasing contemporary portraiture attracts entries from across the island of Ireland, and from Irish artists

practising as far afield as Spain, the United States, Poland and Germany. This exhibition features a shortlist of artworks chosen by the 2018 judging panel: Tanya Kiang, Geraldine O'Neill and Sue Rainsford. The winner of the Zurich Portrait Prize will receive a cash prize of €15,000, plus a commission worth €5,000, to create a work for inclusion in the National Portrait Collection. There are also two awards of €1,500 for highly commended works.

Markievicz: Portraits & Propaganda

27 October 2018 - 10 February 2019 Room 31. Free admission

On the centenary of the First Dáil, this exhibition will focus on arguably one of the most significant, intriguing, and provocative members of the first parliament of the Irish Revolutionary Republic. Constance Gore-Booth studied art in London and Paris, and in 1900 married Count Dunin-Markievicz, a Polish aristocrat and artist. In 1903, the couple moved to Dublin.

Countess Markievicz became involved in nationalist politics. She joined the Irish Citizen Army and took part in the Easter Rising in 1916. She was sentenced to death for her part in the rebellion, but this was commuted on account of her gender. In 1918 she was the first woman elected to the British parliament, winning a seat for Sinn Féin in Dublin. She opposed the Anglo-Irish treaty of 1921 and was a founder member of Fianna Fáil in 1926. The display will explore aspects of her complex and enigmatic identity through her visual portrayal in painting, photography, illustration and film.

Several years ago, Dr Alexander de Bruin, of the Noord-Hollands Archief in Haarlem, made an extraordinary discovery. During an inventory of the Archive's holdings, he found a collection of 34 unsigned seventeenth-century animal studies, which he identified as being by the Dutch artist Frans Post (1612–1680), from his expedition to Brazil in the 1600s. The Gallery's exhibition *Curious Creatures: Frans Post & Brazil* showcases this rediscovered cache of drawings for the first time outside the Netherlands.

Post spent seven years in Brazil, from 1637–44, during which time he was charged with documenting the landscape for Johan Maurits (1604-1679), Governor-General of the new Dutch colony. On his return to the Netherlands in 1644, he painted Brazilian-inspired landscapes featuring a wealth of exotic creatures. Scholars of the artist had long suspected that he used observational sketches of the local wildlife for his paintings, however until De Bruin's discovery, no actual drawings of the native fauna by him were known.

The drawings, depicting such animals as the South American tapir, the jaguar, the caiman and the spider monkey, provide the missing link between Post's Brazilian adventure and the paintings, replete with exotic creatures, that he produced on his return to Haarlem. The studies, particularly the finished gouaches, include amusing inscriptions that describe the appearance, mobility, temperament, peculiar habits and edibility of these mainly South American creatures.

Brazil, 1662 (Rijksmuseum, Amsterdam); a drawing of a sugar mill (Atlas Van Stolk, Rotterdam); and the Gallery's own Brazilian Landscape with Sugar Mill, 1660s, are also included in the exhibition. These works provide an insight into how the artist both engaged with and immortalised the so-called 'New World' for a curious European audience. The Gallery is delighted to collaborate with the National Museum of Ireland - Natural History which has loaned a range of zoological specimens enabling the visitor to see in reality the animals represented in Post's drawings and paintings.

Installation

Installed in May 2018, Joe Caslin's towering mural *Finding Power* continues on display in the Gallery's Courtyard this autumn. The large scale temporary installation is the culmination of Caslin's in-depth investigation of Frederic William Burton's work and the role of the artist or public persona. Caslin explored the complex relationship between pedestals of power, agency and control, through immersive engagement with the Gallery team, project photographer Gavin Leane and a panel of public and private figures. A Portrait of Stephen Moloney was used in the final work.
