


Conor's dragon seems to be particularly shy today. Fortunately, Natalie is amazing with animals. One of her best friends in the world is her dog, Biscuit.


Jack signs **'okqq'** to the dragon and **'follow me'**, and leads him to a pond so he can drink.

The star said that he supposed he might as well head off home, back to the sky. The children all felt a little bit bad for him. "Oh don't worry", said the star,






"I got to meet all of you. Thank you so much for rescuing me, and because you did, I'm going to grant you all a wish!"

When everything finally calmed down, the very happy star thanked the children. He said,


