Explore five treasures of the national portrait collection, through engaging discussions with one of our expert guides. - Sofonisba Anguissola, Portrait of Prince Alessandro Farnese, c.1560
- Francisco José de Goya y Lucientes, Doña Antonia Zárate, c.1805
- Sarah Purser, Le Petit Déjeuner, 1881
- John Lavery, The Artist's Studio, 1910-1913
- John Lavery, Portrait of Lady Lavery as Kathleen Ni Houlihan, 1927
