



Atrium

The Atrium is a spacious, light-filled venue with crisp lines and warm wooden accents. Located in the heart of the Gallery's Beit Wing, this space can accommodate up to 60 for dinner or 100 for a standing reception.

The Atrium's close proximity to the Irish Rooms and Print Gallery make it an ideal location for hosts wishing to incorporate tours of the national collection for their guests.


Wintergarden & Millennium Wing Foyer

Originally the garden of the Georgian house at No 5, South Leinster Street, the Wintergarden is a bright and contemporary space located in our Millennium Wing.



Functioning as a café by day, the Wintergarden transforms into an elegant and modern venue space by night lending itself to a variety of events including dinner for up to 110 and standing receptions for up to 300.

Exclusive access to the exhibitions in the adjacent galleries can also be arranged as part of your event.



Shaw Room

One of the most stunning spaces in the Gallery, the Shaw Room is named for the famed playwright George Bernard Shaw. It is also home to Daniel Maclise's monumental painting *The Marriage of Strongbow and Aoife* (1854).



The Shaw Room was part of the major refurbishment project of the Gallery's historic wings and provides an unparalleled grandeur for gala dinners, receptions and performances.
